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LEHIGH COAL & NAVIGATION BUILDING

DEVELOPMENT PLANS FOR 2018

UNCDC has two exciting new projects in development for 2018. The first is the 36-unit Fallbrook inter-generational housing development in Carbondale. This exciting community development project will include multiple innovative design features including an outdoor walking trail, a community garden, five multi-purpose community rooms, and four apartments that are designed for larger extended families. UNC plans to relocate the Carbondale Active Older Adult Center to the site and also provide many social services to the residents of the greater Carbondale Community.

The second project that UNCDC will develop in 2018 are the Madison Avenue Townhomes. These two bedroom townhomes will be constructed for use by the LIFE Geis-

inger program. They will provide much needed housing for participants in the LIFE program as a nursing home prevention program. The partners for the Madison Avenue project include the City of Scranton, the Lackawanna County Land Bank, the Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency, and LIFE Geisinger.

UNCDC IMPLEMENTS HOMELESS PREFERENCE AT PROPERTIES

In coordination with the Scranton/Lackawanna County Continuum of Care, UNCDC implemented a homeless preference for all of our apartments in the City of Scranton. This preference allows individuals and families that are currently or were recently homeless to be given first-priority on our waitlist.

While applicants must meet all other requirements for housing, the preference allows for homeless individuals to more rapidly secure much needed housing in a time of crisis. UNCDC hopes to use our successes to influence other property managers in our community to implement a similar preference as we work toward ending homelessness in northeastern Pennsylvania.
